RE: City of Edgewood Launches Food Truck Pilot Program to Enhance Local Dining Scene

EDGEWOOD, WA – (February 8, 2026) – The City of Edgewood is excited to announce its new Food Truck Pilot Program. Starting February 9, 2026, food truck operators may apply for a new yearly Food Truck Permit in preparation for the summer season. This pilot program supports small business by removing onerous permitting and financial hurdles while increasing the available food options for the community. Under the new pilot program guidelines, food trucks will not need a Temporary Use Permit or pay the associated \$500 fee — a significant reduction in the cost of doing business within city limits.

“We’ve heard from the community over the years that they enjoy diverse dining options closer to home,” said Mayor Dave Olson. “This program is a step forward for the community as it will promote small business in Edgewood and provide additional options desired by the community.”

To further the city’s commitment to enhancing community experiences, the City has also issued a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) seeking food truck operators and mobile cart vendors that would like to operate at Edgewood City Hall and the Edgewood Community Park. Aligned with the Food Truck Pilot Program, the City hopes this RFQ will activate these existing public spaces, foster a family-friendly atmosphere for neighbors to connect, and demonstrate to these businesses how restaurants could succeed and thrive in the community.

“These wonderful public spaces have a lot of untapped potential,” said Jeremy Metzler, Community Development Director, continuing, “and we think it is the perfect time for our community to experience them more completely.”
